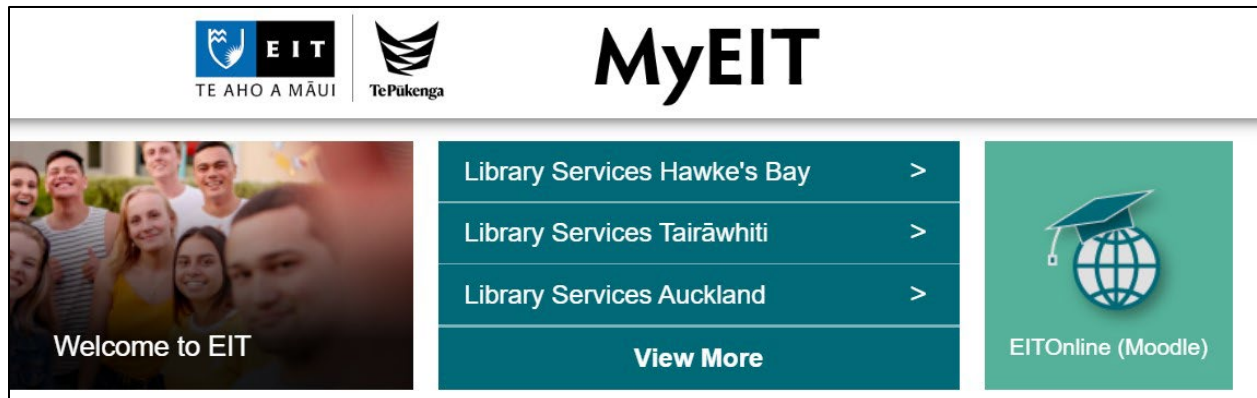


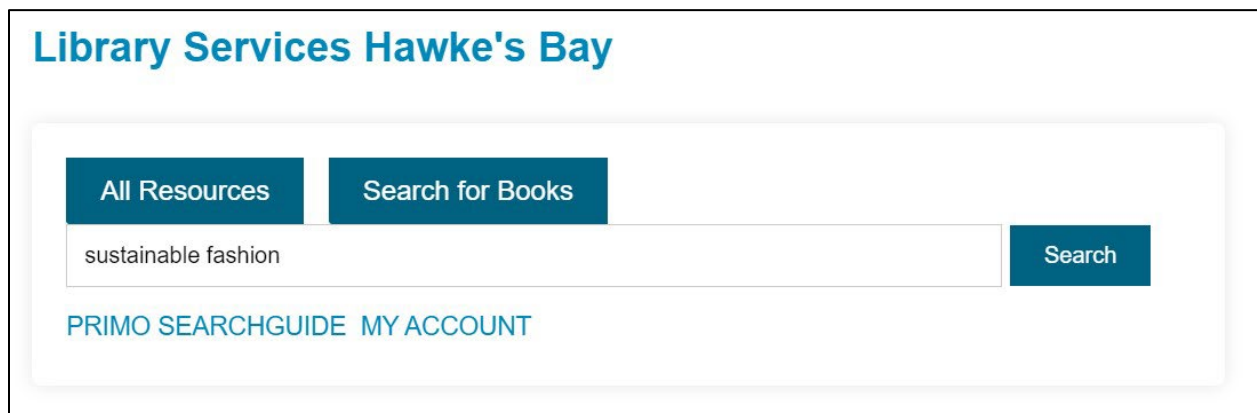
Finding Books

Primo, the main library search tool, will search for both print and electronic books.

Access Primo Search via any of the *Library Services* links on MyEIT (myeit.eit.ac.nz).



Search for relevant keywords (e.g. topics, title, authors)



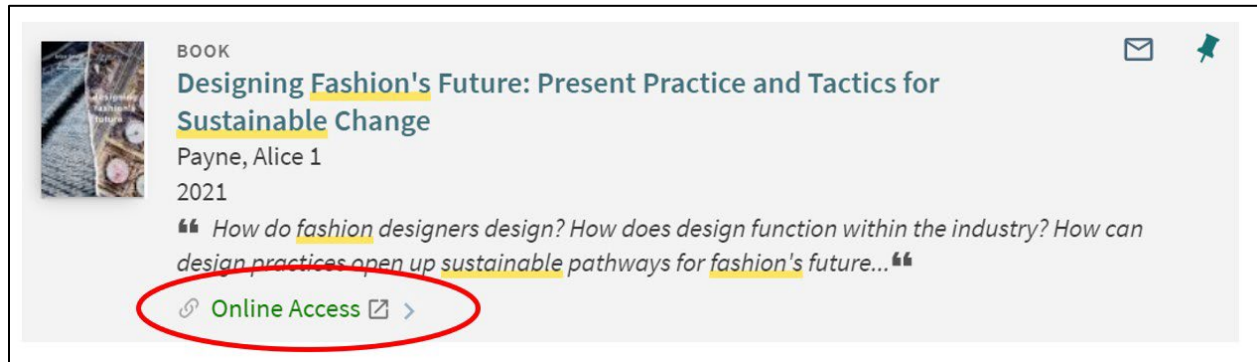
Select *Books* under the search box. On the right, you can further restrict the search to print or online books.
