
Finding Journal Articles

Journal articles are primarily accessed via academic research databases. Primo Search, the main library search tool, allows you to search across multiple databases simultaneously, so this can be a good place to start.

Access Primo Search via any of the Library Services links on MyEIT (myeit.eit.ac.nz).




Search for keywords relevant to your topic.



Limit your search results to journal articles with the *Articles* limiter under the search bar or use *Peer Reviewed Journals* on the right-hand side of the results to restrict to peer reviewed articles.



Scroll down the menu on the right-hand side of the results for more limiters. The date limiter is at the bottom to restrict your results to more current journal articles.

Any active filters are displayed to the top right of your results. These can be deselected as required.



Access to the full-text article is provided by links underneath the article information.

If accessing an article off campus, you will be prompted to enter your EIT username and password.

Google Scholar is another option to search across multiple databases at once. Please refer to the Google Scholar guide for more information.
