Using GenAl Tools

Introduction

These guidelines help you use Generative AI (GenAI) tools responsibly and ethically in your studies at EIT, while protecting your privacy, respecting cultural values, and maintaining academic integrity.

Approved GenAl Tool

- Use Microsoft Copilot Chat as a GenAl tool (available via <u>web browser</u>, Outlook, and Teams).
- You must be signed in with your EIT email to access Copilot securely.
- Some EIT applications may include built-in AI features, which are acceptable to use.
- Some courses may include additional AI tools and software as part of the coursework, which are acceptable to use.

Privacy & Safety

- Never enter personal or sensitive information into GenAl prompts or search engines.
- Do not record meetings using GenAl tools without everyone's consent. If an Al bot joins your meeting, it should be removed.

Academic and Assessment Use

Read the instructions on each assessment carefully. An assessment **may** allow for the use of GenAl to **generate ideas or guide your thinking**, but if allowed:

- Do not let GenAl complete the assessment (or part of assessment) for you.
- Verify all GenAl-generated content and cite academic sources.
- Reference GenAl use properly to avoid plagiarism. Use the <u>APA Referencing Tool</u>.

Ethical & Cultural Awareness

- GenAl tools may reflect **biases** (cultural, gender, political). Use them critically.
- GenAl may not accurately represent Mātauranga Māori or Pacific knowledge.
- Respect Māori Data Sovereignty: Māori data is a taonga and must be treated with care.
